To foster the development of more responsive policies and governance;

To help stakeholders diagnose and address issues of public concern.

- Leaders from across the political spectrum have reported that polls are important to their work and encourage continued polling;
- Inclusive process: the polling instrument was developed in consultation with political parties, government, and civil society leaders.

ABOUT THE POLL

- Fieldwork dates:November 19 -December 13, 2019
- 2,180 completed interviews (35% response rate)
- The average margin of error is +/- 1.9%
- Note: the margin of error is different for every response

SAMPLE

- A nationally representative sample (excluding occupied territories) including oversampled areas of the <u>Capital</u>, <u>large</u> <u>Urban</u>, <u>Small Urban</u>, <u>Rural</u> and <u>Minority</u> Settlements
- Large Urban stratum consists of cities with a population 40K or more: Batumi, Zugdidi, Rustavi, Poti, Gori, and Kutaisi
- Small Urban stratum consists of the rest of the cities/dabas holding urban status, and
- Minority stratum consists of settlements, where ethnic minorities (mostly Armenians & Azerbaijani) compose at least 40% of the voters in given settlement. Settlements within this stratum are dispersed throughout Kvemo Kartli, Samtskhe-Javakheti & Kakheti regions.

METHODOLOGY

We use random sampling at all stages. We use a complex survey design:

- Stratification dividing population in relatively homogenous sub-groups; and
- Clustering randomly selecting small geographic areas for each sub-group (stratum).
- Households are selected via random route sampling;
- Respondents are selected using a Kish table;
- Randomly selected households and individuals are not substituted; and
- All interviews were conducted face-to-face with 18+ population, using tablets, in Georgian, Armenian, and Azeri.
























Performance of the Georgian Orthodox Church










































What do you expect from the member of the Parliament (MP)? (q23_2) Will only serve his/her own interests




What do you expect from the member of the Parliament (MP)? (q23_4) Will do what the party tells him/her to do







If an MP were to contact you, what would be the best form? (q26)
















































Trust towards TV channels








Internet usage - rural





Which of the following do you do most frequently when you are browsing the Internet? Please name three most frequent activities. (q43) - of the 69% who use the internet






Do you mostly trust, sometimes trust or never trust to the political news you encounter on Facebook? (q45) - **of the 57% who encounters political news on Facebook**






Selection of Supreme Court Judges






Constitutional change on proportional electoral system


